### **NUISANCES BY-LAW**

We are counting on your collaboration to better quality of our environment.

#### **Extract of the nuisance by-law 06-03**

It is prohibited, to the owner, a tenant or any person occupying a property:

- To throw, leave or store material and/or objects representing a nuisance.

Examples: solid waste, scrap iron, tires, household appliances, furniture, household garbage, empty bottles, waste from trimming/pruning grass clippings, dead leaves, glass, wood, soil, stone, brick, concrete, gravel, plaster, debris from construction or demolition, machinery, etc.

- To leave a building in a dilapidated state such that it loses 50% of its' original value on the assessment roll, and one which constitutes a danger to anyone who is in the surrounding area or presents a high risk fire hazard.
- To use of a vehicle or parts of a vehicle for storage on lot or a residential property.
- To have a vehicle that was manufactured more than seven (7) years ago, that not licensed (plates) for the current year and that is not in working order.

A vehicle having a "storage" plate may be stored for one (1) year.

- To have an excavation done, leaving an accumulation of earth, stones or other similar materials which cannot be reasonably recognized as being an integral part of the landscape of the said lot
- To leave any product recognized as being a pollutant to the environment, such as acid hydrocarbons, chemical products or smoke emitted from anything other than burning wood, branches and other products recognized for heating purposes.

#### **Penalties**

Any person or corporate body who commits an offence will be liable to pay a fine varying from \$150.00 to \$3,000.00.

## BULKY OBJECTS

Bulky objects will now be picked-up with your household refuse each week (Ex. washer, dryer, stove, etc.)

**Important :** Note that the following items are **not** included in the regular pick-up :

- **Hazardous materials such as paint, used motor oil, tires and auto parts ; bags filled with leaves, grass or branches ; construction material, etc.**

**N.B** A special pick-up will be organized this fall for hazardous materials. We will notify you.

## RIVERS, LAKES AND WATER COURS

### An environment to be preserved...

It is prohibited to do any type of work on the shore line of a lake, river or any water course without obtaining an the authorization from the Municipality, the Ministère du développement durable, de l'Environnement et des Parcs or from the Société de la faune et des parcs du Québec. (819) 772-3434.

Anyone having done forbidden work or work requiring a previous authorization may be brought before the courts and be sentenced, on top of paying a fine, to restore the site.

**FIRE DEPARTMENT**

**Extract of by-law 01-04 concerning fires**

- It is prohibited to anyone to make an open fire on the Municipality of Pontiac’s territory without having obtained authorization in writing from the fire department beforehand.
- However, fires are permitted without any permit, in exterior fireplaces, barbecues or any installation equipped with a chimney or a fire screen provided that it is under constant supervision.
- A campfire must be done in a secure area, under constant supervision and the flames must not exceed 48 inches high. **An adequate type of extinguisher must be readily available at the campfire.**
- No fire will be allowed when there is any indication of an «extreme» risk for forest fires, even if authorization was given by the fire department.
- As a rough guide the following measures will apply:
  - It is prohibited to make a fire on days of high winds;
  - The smoke must not bother neighbours or hinder traffic at any time;
  - A distance of at least 30 feet of any combustible matter must be respected;
  - Flammable liquids should not be used or any other matter enabling a quick and dangerous increase of flames;
  - The only combustible used should be wood and its, by-products, such as paper or cardboard.

You may obtain a kit at the Municipal hall pertaining to takes procedures before burning. A 72 hours delay (3 working days) is required to issue a permit.

**Penalties**

Any person or corporate body who commits an offence is liable to pay a fine varying from \$150.00 to \$3,000.00.
